 - 1. Debt Reduction
 - 2. Vision for Ministry
 - 3. Half and Half
 - ii. Majority vote was for #3, half and half.
 - b. Action: Motion/Second/Pass: to destroy the paper ballots.

d. Legacy of Faith... Moving Forward

- i. Ian McDonald spoke about the campaign.
- ii. We need 18 months of cash stored with Thrivent for mortgage payment protection.
- iii. Current monthly payments are \$19,412.
- iv. We will reamortize the loan this year.

 - 1. 8 months of reserves, \$155,000 to pay down principal
 - 2. Decrease \$1000 a month payment, but still pay the higher payment amount that we currently pay.

 - 1. Reamortize the loan
 - 2. Buy down of mortgage (\$155,000)
 - 3. Keep paying the higher mortgage payment unless absolutely necessary to pay the lower amount

PASTORS' REPORT

What a year 2013 turned out to be for Faith Lutheran Church! Last year at this time, there was hardly a hint of how much transition lay ahead in the new year. It has been a challenging time, but also an exciting one, as God continues to lead Faith in mission and ministry.

The biggest change, of course, came when Pastor Randy Freund accepted a new call, concluding his long and faithful ministry here. We pray God's rich blessing on his new ministry. Thanks to Linda McGraw, Sara Johnson, Jon Kamrath, Derrick Kellen, Dennis Langehaug, Dick Nagy, Deb Roepke and Ashley Christie for their hard, faithful work on the call process. In the end, their recommendation to call our own Dave Wollan was enthusiastically approved by the congregation. Initially called as a contract pastor, Dave graduated from seminary and was ordained on January 5, 2014. Faith Lutheran is blessed to have him serve as a pastor here.

Another careful search was made for a new Director of Youth and Family Ministry and an in-house candidate again rose to the top. Gladys Bonnema worked as a summer youth intern, then filling Dave's old role as an interim Director of Youth and Family Ministry and began the full-time position this fall. She is building beautifully on Dave's legacy.

For many years, Roxanne Wigen and Sue Graff co-directed the Ringers of Faith hand bell choir and provided other music leadership. Since 2010, Sue also served as part-time Worship Coordinator, which included directing Faith Singers. They both chose to retire at the end of this year and we are very grateful for their faithful service. All these staff changes helped free up more for a full-time music position and Mike Lauer began serving as Director of Music and Worship in early January 2014. He and Gladys are both alumni of Faith's youth ministry and it is marvelous to see them back leading ministry here.

There were other significant developments in 2013. After five years of determined effort, Faith's past operating debt was paid off at the end of the year, after meeting all our ministry commitments for a fifth straight year. Generous offerings from Faith's members along with careful fiscal management have put the church in the strongest financial position it has had in many years.

Faith's mission efforts also increased. Various groups within the congregation served free monthly Community Outreach Meals that were open to everyone. We joyfully welcomed Rev. K.K. Alavi and his son, Abdul, for a lengthy visit in the spring. Pastor Paul Knudson organized a short-term mission trip to Ethiopia through the Augustana District in January 2014. The largest group of students ever went on the youth mission trip to New Orleans this summer. And the list goes on...

We are so grateful for the great staff at Faith. Their gifts and passion are vital to the ministry God calls us to do. We also thank the church council, ministry teams and countless volunteers who invest their time and ability in this holy endeavor. We could never do the work of the church without them. It is an enormous blessing to work with them all and to serve all the people of God at Faith Lutheran Church.

Hebrews 13:8 promises, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." We have seen that throughout this year of transitions. It is also our hope for the future. For all that changes in life, Jesus does not. His promise never fails. We look ahead to 2014—whatever change it brings—with certain hope in Christ Jesus and we treasure the privilege of sharing that hope with all of you.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE

Current members of the Personnel Committee are: Kelly Pischke, Kurt Hjerpe, Mark Guggemos, Brad Lueneburg, Thad Johnson, Ian McDonald, Linda McGraw, and Sara Wegner. Outgoing members are: Deb Roepke and Sherry Drahos.

Each year it is the responsibility of this committee to review all staff benefit costs for medical and dental premiums, life insurance, retirement, etc. We compare costs and set policy to stay within budget for these items. All positions are reviewed and recommendations made to council for any staff needs or changes identified. In addition, a yearly review is conducted with each staff person to reflect on past accomplishments as well as looking forward to the next year. We also work with the Finance Team to make budget recommendations for the next year's Ministry Giving Plan.

2013 proved to be a very active year for the Personnel Committee. In March Pastor Randy received a call. After prayerful consideration, he decided to accept the call and resigned his pastoral position here at Faith Lutheran Church. We are thankful for his years of service and continue to reap the benefits of his contributions to our ministry. A call committee was then formed to select a new minister.

In September, after an extensive search and interview process, the congregation voted to issue Dave Wollan a letter of call, which he accepted. We are thrilled to be able to continue to accompany Dave as he expands his role and continues his faith journey with our congregation. However, this change in duties led to a vacancy in Dave's prior position – Director of Youth and Family Ministry. The personnel committee reviewed the position and decided to fill the vacancy as soon as possible. The position was posted and we were fortunate to receive several applications – including some from out of state. The personnel committee, along with youth and adult representatives from the youth ministry, conducted interviews. The Personnel Committee ultimately selected Gladys Bonnema. We are excited to have Gladys on board and look forward to seeing her develop as she mentors with Dave in her new role.

Also in September, Sue Graff formally announced her retirement from the position of Worship Coordinator effective the end of the year. We have been fortunate to have Sue enhance our worship and share her musical talents and gifts these last years. After much consideration and deliberation, it was decided to expand the Worship Coordinator role into a full-time position. We are blessed to have a very talented young man named Mike Lauer joining the staff in January 2014. Mike is excited to begin his career at Faith Lutheran Church. He has a number of innovative and creative ideas which we look forward to experiencing.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRIES

Five months ago I helped lead a youth night where we discussed the topic of "transitions." Little did I know, God was about to transition my world upside down and transition Faith Lutheran in many areas as well. I'm happy to report that despite these major transitions, the youth program continues to thrive.

- Mission Trip We had an amazing trip to New Orleans this year, and it will be put in the record books as the largest trip we've ever had. We ended up with a final count of 87 youth and adult leaders. We worked with children and people with developmental disabilities. It was a great trip with lots of laughter, tears and growth. Praise be to God! Right now, we're getting ready for this summer's trip to Cortez, CO. We're planning to take 72 participants this summer, with the hope of being allowed to bring more.
- Personal As I have transitioned into this position, it has been a delicate dance trying to make the position
 my own, yet be sensitive as I walk into a ministry that was strong before I was here. There are many
 traditions I have continued, and many new ones that I have started or hope to start soon.
- o **Continued Traditions** We have continued many traditions, including: FLYouth on Wednesday nights, confirmation, confirmation hang time, free lunch (if you don't know what this is, ask me! I'd love to tell you about it. It has become one of my favorite ministries in Hutch!), Alumni lunch, New Year's Eve Eve, and many more that I did not list.
- New Traditions I've also been blessed to be a part of many new ministries in the youth program. After the mission trip, we had a group of kids who wanted to serve in Hutchinson that started a Random Acts of Kindness Crew (RAKC). There were also kids who wanted to go deeper in their faith, so we started "Dig." The Dig group meets once a month, has a meal together, and discusses deep topics of the faith. Last summer we did an all-girls sleepover discussing how we view ourselves as women. High School Sunday School has been a new Digging Deeper option currently focused on book of Romans. And finally, in an effort to continue the mission trip experience, we've began doing mini mission trips on the first Wednesday of every month. So far, we have brought pizzas to other youth groups and prayed for them, gone door to door for Trick or Treat for the Food Shelf, and rung bells for Salvation Army.
- Prayer Requests I would love prayer for myself as a leader; that God would continue to show me who I am, that I would be effective and edifying in my teaching, and that I would be satisfied with his work through me. I also request prayer for the youth. You can pray that God would be working in their hearts, convicting them and leading them toward godliness.

I have been at Faith for about 6 months, but I just started full time this month. I have been overwhelmed and shed many tears over how everything has fallen into place, how supportive the entire congregation has been, and how I see God working here. Many of you have blown me away with your compassion and faithfulness and although we often try to do things on our own, I know that I couldn't do any of the work I'm doing if I didn't have great models, encouragement and prayer warriors like yourselves. Thank you, Faith, for being faithful ministers of the good news.

From the Director of Children and Family Ministry

In June Faith Lutheran hosted Vacation Bible School (VBS) for 3 year olds through Kindergarteners from Faith and Christ the King. The theme this year was a Super Hero Training Academy. The children were able to hear from real heroes of the Bible – Moses, Samson, David and of course, Jesus! The month of July meant it was time for the first through fifth graders to have a turn at VBS. This year's theme was Kingdom Rock. Kids learned about God through different Bible stories, crafts, snacks, games, and music!

The death of Sheila Wendlandt, Children's Ministry Director at Christ the King Lutheran in Hutchinson, presented several challenges throughout our many partnerships. We were unable to secure a team for the week we

scheduled Day Camp at Green Lake Lutheran Ministries, so we wrote our own plans (Kim Asche and Kacie Fahey). Christ the King was the host for a four day "camp." Our field trip day took us to the Minnetonka Swimming Pond, which was a blast!

We kicked off Sunday School with our 6th Extravaganza, this year changing it from Wednesday to Sunday afternoon. Classes began on September 15 and we started studying David. This is our sixth year using the Faith Weavers curriculum from Group Publishing. In addition, this program year we are adding a special addition to our regular curriculum. It is a 5-week series from Sola Publishing focusing on the Small Catechism. First through fifth graders will each be learning a different section (sixth graders will continue to receive first communion instruction). By focusing on these important pieces of Lutheran theology, we hope to better prepare the students for confirmation.

The Sprouts option continued this year with an average attendance of about 20 children each Sunday. Last year we added this program during the sermon at the Sanctuary and Foundation services for all 3 year olds through 1st graders. Recognizing that they can get a little squirmy, we invite them to come out and learn the same lesson as the adults, but through games, crafts, snacks and other activities. When the sermon is over the children return back to their parents. Release Time kicked off in October with 60 students attending. This year we are learning about The Fruits of the Spirit.

The Christmas Program was back at Faith Lutheran this year. The 3 year olds through 1st graders told us the story in "Christmas in the Kitchen." The 2nd through 6th graders were given the opportunity to sign up for a Christmas drama instead of the regular program. There were about 20 students involved in the telling of the very first "Twas the Night before Christmas." The 56'ers were asked to perform a Hanging of the Greens service to decorate for Christmas. It was a worshipful service and the kids were excited to be in charge! This group of 5th and 6th graders continues to meet at 3:30pm every Wednesday for a lesson, snack, and fun. The average attendance is 25 - 30 children with several kids bringing friends that are not members of Faith Lutheran.

Thank you to the many people that give so much to Children's Ministry!

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

In the second year of the current capital campaign, *Legacy of Faith...Moving Forward* took several big steps forward:

- o gifts from Faith's members covered the monthly mortgage payments without using reserves;
- o generous offerings, a bequest from Maureen Hantge and the sale of donated property helped make possible an additional \$220,000 payment on the loan principal;
- o add in the monthly payments and Faith reduced its loan amount by nearly \$300,000 last year;
- o the loan was then re-amortized, reducing the required monthly payment, but we have continued to make payments at the old, higher level to reduce the principal more quickly;
- o all told, Faith has made 6 years' worth of principal reduction in just 3 years!

FAITHLIFE CAMP

PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY

Our Faith Lutheran Prayer Shawl Ministry began in May, 2006. We have 14 women actively involved in the Prayer Shawl Ministry. In 2013 we presented 57 shawls and this brings our total shawls presented to 687. Our shawls are given to residents of nursing home/care centers, missionaries serving abroad, Common Cup Ministry, those who are hospitalized, those who celebrate milestone birthdays or anniversaries, those who are mourning the death of a loved one and others. This year we presented shawls to our high school graduates. The prayer shawl serves as a physical reminder that they are remembered in prayer.

This summer we sent two prayer squares with each person going on the mission trip – one to remind them that we would hold them in prayer and one to share with someone they met on the trip.

Our prayer shawl ministry includes prayer blankets for newborn babies. A prayer blanket is presented to each family of Faith when a child joins their family. This year we presented 8 prayer blankets for a total of 123 blankets given. THANK YOU to all who create our beautiful shawls and blankets.

We supply yarn for our shawl makers. The yarn is purchased through gifts of money from the Women's Ministry, the Endowment Fund, Mission and Outreach and donations. THANK YOU for your continued support.

As the year 2013 ends, we are grateful to our women who have been faithful in prayer and Bible study, and to those who have supported one another as women and volunteered in so many ways. - We continue to support Pastor K.K. Alavi in his ministry to Muslims in the southwestern part of India. He is reaching out to thousands of Muslims every year through Internet and mailed Bible.
- The Otten School continues to receive our help. The Otten School is located about 40 minutes from Pastor K.K. Christian, Muslim and Hindu boys and girls attend this certified school. Each day all of the students start out with Christian prayer and each Friday afternoon they are invited to attend a Bible study. Over 100 children attend these studies. Praise the Lord! Pastor K.K. is on the Board of Directors of Otten School.
- o In cooperation with Dr. Christoph, we continue to support Pastor Titus in northern Nigeria, Africa. He is fearless as he preaches about Jesus Christ and faces daily danger. He has requested more shorts and dresses for Christians who have lost their homes due to terrorism. Right now dresses are being sewn but we'll need shorts. (If you'd like to help with this ministry, contact Dorothy Desens.)
- Frank Hutton continues to develop friendships with international college students in Minneapolis and St.
 Paul. He connects Christian students with international students, invites them to his home and takes them to retreats, always talking about our Savior.
- Kim Gustafson lives in the Minneapolis area. He is a former missionary and now teaches missionaries how to reach out to Muslims.

This past April/May we invited Pastor K.K. and his son Abdul to the United States. During their stay in Minnesota, they also traveled to Wisconsin and South Dakota to tell of their mission to Muslims. Thank you for your kind words, meals and support to Pastor K.K. and Abdul.

The Spiritual Formation ministry team has a wide variety of Children's and Youth Ministries activities and programs that it works with every year. The team supports Christian parents in nurturing the faith of children and youth in the church by various means throughout the church. During 2013 we focused on:

- New Staff While it was a great pleasure to have Dave Wollan as the Director of Youth and Family Ministry, we are happy to see him continue to move forward into his new role as pastor. We have welcomed Gladys Bonnema in Dave's former role and thoroughly enjoy working with her as she gets acquainted as the new Director of Youth and Family Ministry.
- Extravaganza The Fall Extravaganza was Sun. Sept. 8, 2013, and once again a huge success. We did move the time/date change from a Wednesday evening to a Sunday immediately following the 10:10 a.m. services. The turnout seemed to be better as there was great interaction amongst the kids and teachers. Once again, we had an excellent turnout with Sunday School registrants. We also added a few more adult stations (large inflatable obstacle course) and kept almost all activities outside, which encouraged participation.
- Community Outreach Meal The Spiritual Formation team served the Community Outreach Meal on March 3, 2013. We served a spaghetti dinner.

 fundraiser we are able to earn more money, and it is less work to coordinate, setup/tear down than some of
 the other fundraisers we have done. The pizza earnings were equivalent to 2.5 years in donations for the
 Easter breakfast and Drive-in Diner fundraisers combined.
- O New Orleans Mission Trips Faith Lutheran prides itself on their mission trips and adding value to people's lives in spreading the word of God. This year's mission trip to New Orleans created a great abundance of hopeful leaders. This year's youth trip was so successful that YouthWorks blessed us with an additional 20 spots, which immediately filled up, plus a waiting list. With the additional spots, came additional costs and budget issues. A generous motion was made by the church council for the church to cover the additional costs of an extra 15-passenger van rental.
- Kid Power This program is an affordable option for children to attend on days when school is not in session (e.g. Christmas break, spring break.) Throughout the year, we evaluated whether this program is something Faith wants to continue to offer. While KidPower receives rave reviews, we have inconsistent attendance. We also lack volunteers and leaders.
- O Too many more to mention While the items listed above were a few examples of what we focused on, the Spiritual Formation Team and our children's and youth ministry directors (Kacie & Gladys) are always busy planning events and activities to keep our children and youth interested and excited to come to church and its events. Other team events included: volunteer appreciation brunch, high school senior graduate brunch, confirmation reception, high school retreat, cookie bake, Digging Deeper sessions, Christmas programs, nursery curriculums, FLY Alumni lunch, annual New Year's Eve Eve party, snow tubing event, miscellaneous fund raisers and too many more to mention.

2013 Financial Update

- Total revenue received in 2013 was \$760,063.77, which is an increase of \$26,650.24 or 3.63% from the previous year. It should be noted that in 2012 we did not receive our Federal Health Care Tax Credit of \$10,920.24 by year end. Therefore, in 2013 we received our Federal Tax Credit for 2012 and 2013 for a total of \$21,632.47. Due to changes in staff, personnel costs were \$23,701.30 or 5.30% lower in 2013 than they were in 2012.
- Financial gifts to missions equaled 10.70% of prior year offering revenue.
- Contingency expense was high in 2013 due to not receiving our 2012 Federal Tax Credit by year-end
 and council's approval to use part of that money to replace the Sanctuary video equipment in April of
 2012.
- The General Fund past operating debt beginning principal balance in 2013 was \$91,865.19. Due to
 decreased personnel expenses and your generous support, we were able to eliminate that debt totally
 in 2013.
- Our beginning cash balance in 2013 was \$36,937. This cash balance allowed us to pay all bills in a timely manner with no internal borrowing of funds. We show a net loss of \$19,835 for 2013 mostly due to using cash reserves to pay off the remaining past operating debt. We still end the year with a cash balance of \$18,589, which appears on the balance sheet.
- Ministry revenue is income received outside of regular offerings. It includes such items as Thrivent Choice dollars, radio sponsorships, fees for programs, and reimbursements for staff time from the Institute of Lutheran Theology and Augustana District.

The 2014 Budget Proposal

- Due to the elimination of our past operating debt, we are able to decrease our overall budget by \$11,589 from last year. Offerings of \$696,013 and Ministry Revenue of 43,861.00 will be needed to meet the budget commitments. This is a decrease of 1.54% from 2012 revenues needed to meet our budgeted commitments.
- Mission giving is calculated to reach our tithe of (10%) of offering revenue.
- The decrease in the personnel budget is due to several changes in staff.
