

Pastors' Page

Faith Lutheran Church has been greatly blessed by generous offerings that have met or exceeded annual expenses in 13 of the last 14 years—and the one year that missed still came very close. During that time, the annual church budget has grown, though not dramatically so, to meet the many ministry opportunities that the good Lord keeps putting before us. Meanwhile, the family of Faith has not only maintained, but slightly increased support for mission agencies at home and abroad, and taken on special projects such as the purchase of the Ansgar House and the Faith Lutheran Internship Program. To be in such a financially healthy state is cause for profound gratitude and praise to God.

Yet, a recent analysis of giving patterns in the church (which included only age groups and amounts given, not any names) revealed some concerns. For example, just the 10 highest-giving households provided 23% of all the General Fund offerings Faith received in 2023. The top 70 households gave 62% of offerings. In rough terms, that means nearly 2/3's of the church's annual expenses are coming from less than 10% of Faith's households.

First of all, **thank God** for providing abundant resources to those households and inspiring their commitment to Faith's ministry! And I trust that it goes without saying that Faith Lutheran **deeply appreciates every offering** that is given, no matter its size!

At the same time, however, this pattern reveals that Faith Lutheran's finances are like an inverted pyramid—the bulk of our annual ministry rests on a very narrow base, and even one major change in that base could pose a serious problem for the church. Beyond that, in 2023 fully 25% of the church's income was given in the month of December. If that pattern should continue, one serious winter event could create a financial catastrophe for the church. It seems clear that the family of Faith still has ample room to grow in our financial stewardship, which is not only a monetary discipline, but chiefly a spiritual one.

The church staff recently went on its annual one-day retreat. We focused on the Biblical principles and practices of stewardship. We will talk more about this in the coming months, but let me emphasize continued from pg. 1 just two key points the Bible makes about financial stewardship:

Pastor's Page

Christian giving is not mainly concerned with the church or its ministry, nor how my income or giving compares to others. Rather, it centers on how God has blessed me or my household. It calls each one of us to manage faithfully what God entrusts to us. We are not called to give because there are needs, here at Faith or elsewhere, but rather because we all have a need to give in order to keep our spiritual houses in order.

Christian giving calls for equal sacrifice, not equal gifts. The best way to do that is to base our offerings on a percentage of our income, whether it is 1%, 5%, 10% or more. This method directly reflects what God has first given us and will almost always result in more generous giving than using flat dollar amounts. Moreover, people who begin to give in this way all testify that they do not miss the money they give, but always have enough to meet their needs.

I encourage you to break out your pay stubs, financial records and household budgets. Compare your giving to your income or assets to see what the percentage currently is. Then consider what it would mean to increase that, perhaps by 1%. Above all, trust in God's promise to provide for you so that you can freely and joyfully give—whether to the church or a hundred other worthy causes—knowing that "God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work." (II Corinthians 9:8)

Stump the Pastor

Q: The pastors often talk about baptism, but, like most people, I can't even remember mine. What is baptism supposed to mean to me and what difference does it actually make?

A: This is a really important question, because it reveals a basic difference among

various Christian churches about what baptism is and how it works. Many churches make baptism dependent on the individual Christians who receive it, so that it becomes all about what I believe, what I experience, how sincere I was at the time I was baptized or how devoutly I believe now. The problem with that approach, as you can see, is that "I" becomes the subject of every sentence and the promise of baptism is made contingent on me and my feelings. In fact, this view really does not see baptism as a sacrament, where God is at work, but simply as a way to testify to God and others about my decision for Christ or my commitment to him. As sinners, we are not nearly reliable enough for that to be a solid foundation for our faith.

Lutherans believe that in Holy Baptism, God is the subject of all the sentences. God is at work, establishing a covenant of salvation with those baptized, putting them to death in their sin and raising them up as new creatures in Christ. Since that is a spiritual death, not a physical one, we continue to sin and so God repeats the action of baptism in us over and over again. We don't ever need to be re-baptized, however, because it's a sacrament that relies on God's promise and commitment, not ours. For Christians to be re-baptized, even with the most sincere motives, suggests that God somehow didn't do it right the first time or that I need to step in to reinforce His promises.

Instead, we can rely on our baptism completely, even if it occurred when we were too young to know it, because it all depends on God and He never fails to keep His promises. Even if people later wander away from their baptism, God waits patiently, like the father in the Parable of the Prodigal Son, to welcome them back with open arms and restore them to their baptismal covenants.

It isn't a problem if you, like me, cannot remember your baptism, because God remembers and God is faithful. It all depends on Him, not you. You can cling for dear life to the promise of your baptism, all through life and even in the hour of death, because God has claimed you as His own child in Christ Jesus, and He will never let you go.

"For I am not ashamed of the Gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek." Romans 1:16


For nearly 13 years, Guy and Leia Johnson have been leading teams of university students to bear witness without apology to other university students near and far. Guy has risen to a major leadership role in preparing these witnesses through CRU (formerly known as Campus Crusade for Christ). His gifts and perseverance bring a powerful witness that Faith Lutheran has the privilege of supporting through our prayers and annual mission outlays.

Guy recently reported that, in April, he and other leaders of CRU had the privilege of commissioning 353 current college students for a year or two of serving as interns, bearing witness to Christ in university settings both here in America as well as

in foreign countries. Guy himself will be supervising 33 of these interns on multiple campuses in the United States.

FLC's support for the Johnsons is \$3,000 for this year. It may not be a major portion of their need,

but through this gift we continue to stand with them in "not (being) ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation..."


