


"How to talk to your kids..." Tackling difficult subjects with your kids

Faith Groups are a great way to connect with others about faith in a shortterm small group experience. This fall's Faith Group series is "By What Authority?" as we explore how we read and interpret the Bible, and apply that knowledge to a few current topics in the church. Faith Groups will watch a recorded teaching by Pastor Scott or Pastor Dave, and then discuss the lesson with small group questions. Crossways Bible Study

A new year-one Crossways Bible study will begin in September. Crossways is a "big picture" study of the entire Bible. It includes an overview of each book, placed within the framework of the Bible's "big story." Stump the Pastor

Q: If God is in heaven, why do we look down when we pray?

A: Christians are not required to adopt any particular posture when we pray. We can pray anytime and anywhere, eyes open or closed, hands folded or not. There are many hints in the Bible that God's people looked up when they prayed, as in Psalm

141:2, "Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice."

In Luke 18, however, Jesus told a parable of two men who "went up to the temple to pray." One was a Pharisee whose prayer was prideful and self-righteous. The parable does not say how he prayed, but Jesus noted that the other man, who was in great spiritual distress, "would not even look up to heaven" as he begged for God's mercy. That wording suggests that the normal posture for prayer was to look up to heaven, but also that looking down while praying signified humility and repentance.

That is the chief reason that Christians traditionally bow our heads when we pray. To look down and avoid making eye contact has long been a way to show humility. As we come before God as sinners in need of mercy, it is fitting to do so humbly and contritely.

There is also a more practical reason for bowing our heads, closing our eyes and folding our hands when we pray. It prevents distractions, helping us to concentrate on the prayers we offer and on God's presence with us. It is by no means a requirement, but just a helpful practice to make time spent in prayer as enriching as possible.



Stewardship Matters

The treasurer's report at last year's annual meeting included an appeal to the family of Faith to change the long-term pattern of opening up an enormous deficit during the year and relying on a flood of giving in December to overcome it. The plea was to spread out the offerings we give more evenly through the year, since the church's expenses are fairly level from month to month.

Unfortunately, this summer has seen that old pattern emerge. Offerings, especially in June, dropped significantly, while expenses are actually a bit higher than usual, not least because three payroll dates will fall in August, rather than the typical two. Please consider carefully how God has blessed you and offer a percentage of that back to the ministry He has given us here at Faith. "God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work." (II Corinthians 9:8)

Phase II Finance Team

The Phase II Finance Team is doing a lot of work behind the scenes to discern how best to raise the funds necessary to complete Phase II of Faith's long-term building plan. The team members spent significant time reviewing the last 20 years of capital campaigns at FLC and how they were conducted. They reviewed data about our church, along with public financial data about McLeod County to assist in determining our financial goals.

With that background, the team interviewed two consulting firms potentially to assist us with this process, but decided to move forward using an internal team of Faith Lutheran Church members, rather than hire an external consulting firm. This decision will reduce campaign expenses, but also increase the work-load for P2FT and the church staff. Please help them out by watching for campaign information as it rolls out this fall and responding with your commitment to the effort. Thank You!

Mission Partners in Ethiopia Overwhelmed by Inflation Challenges



One of the mission partners that Faith Lutheran Church supports through the Augustana District is the Tabor Congregation outreach program. This congregation sends out approximately 40 evangelists. In response to our inquiry about the effects of inflation on their evangelists, the leader of their elders indicated that, in 2023, the inflation rate was 29% and now in 2024 another 20% inflation is facing them. Until recently their evangelists were receiving \$125-\$150 per month. Imagine having inflation account for a more than 50% decrease in buying power in a two-year period! The Augustana District, and we as a congregation, surely need to reflect on our response to this concern.

Faith Lutheran supports two evangelists in a congregation led by Pastor Dawit y Wario, who previously served at Tabor. Pastor Dawit noted that his salary, a modest \$320.00 per month, now has a buying power after inflation of approximately \$170. To live in one of the world's most populated cities, Addis Ababa, with that level of income is overwhelming.

We in America are also faced with inflation pressures. It may be good for us, however, to consider what some of our brothers and sisters in Christ are facing as they pour out their lives in witness to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior of all.


2) Caregiver Support Group

Program Year Sunday Morning Schedule


