

Dr. Harry Wendt wrote the *Crossways* Bible study that I have taught for many years. Along the way, he coined many memorable phrases and images. One of my favorites is his description of Christmas: "God's Son crept down the backstairs of Bethlehem and settled in a manger." It beautifully represents how God sent His Son into the world, not with fanfare and grand announcements, but in a humble, largely unnoticed birth to a peasant couple in a small village far from their home.

From the very start, the poignant circumstances of Jesus' birth marked him as being destined for the cross, not for the royal glory that was widely expected for the Messiah, the Savior sent from God. His joyful birth under such difficult conditions pulls at our heartstrings and helps to make Christmas such a beloved holiday.

At the same time, though, I wonder if the unobtrusive way that Jesus "crept down the backstairs of Bethlehem and settled in a manger" can disguise the ultimate significance of Christmas. The truth is that, even as Jesus "crept down the backstairs of Bethlehem," the Incarnation was an invasion, a stealthy attack on the forces of sin, death and the devil. It was the prelude to war, as God's Son waded into battle to deliver you and me from our own sin and rebellion. Jesus entered the fray knowing it would end with his torturous death on the cross, yet he willingly and obediently accepted that mission from God the Father.

The old movie *The Longest Day* depicted the invasion of France by the Allied Forces on D-Day in 1944. Its long opening sequence focuses on the hours before the invasion began. As the soldiers wait for it to start, their anticipation and anxiety run sky-high. Their nerves are raw and they're all jumpy. Some are driven to examine their lives, others to throw caution to the wind. Knowing what is coming, they can hardly control the adrenaline-fueled energy coursing through them.

I wonder if that is also what the halls of heaven felt like as Christmas drew near. The angels watched in anxious expectation as the battle plan took shape. They waited with bated breath through the hours of Mary's labor. Then, they manned their battle stations to watch over this holy child through the years until he launched his public ministry.

What We *Don't* Know about Christmas: A Careful Reading of the Christmas Gospels

Christian imagination has filled in many details in the accounts of Jesus' birth in Matthew and Luke, so that what we "know"

about Christmas may not actually be in the text. This class will take a careful look at the Biblical texts to sort out what is written from what has been assumed. Meeting in the office conference room with Pastor Scott.



O: I saw a reference to Jerusalem as the city of David, but the angel who told the shepherds about Jesus' birth called Bethlehem the city of David. Which one is it?

A: The answer is that they both are. Bethlehem is the city of David because he was born and raised there. Jerusalem is the city of David because he conquered it, and then made it the political and religious capital of Israel.

At the time Jesus was born, most people would have heard any reference to the city of David as applying to Jerusalem, not Bethlehem. That suggests, at least, that the angel's language was a veiled critique of the religious and social power structures in Jerusalem, and an indication that, while Jesus was the "Savior ... Messiah (and) Lord" whom God had long promised to send, he would not be a typically royal figure as most Jewish people expected. He came with a greater agenda and a very different method of conquering his enemies by submitting to them and dying on the cross.



Special "FLIP" Sunday

On Sunday, December 15, the pre-k through first-grade students will sing at the 10:10 a.m. Sanctuary Service. This will lead to a number of families who usually attend the Foundation service worshiping in the sanctuary instead. To keep the sanctuary from getting too crowded, the Sanctuary and Foundation worship styles will "flip" that day. That means the Sanctuary style worship service will be in a different space, the Foundation, but with the same service style. Meanwhile, a Foundation style service will be held in the Sanctuary. Holy Communion will be administered at the service held in Foundation. You are welcome to worship in your usual space or you are invited to worship in a different space with the same service style you are used to.

Do you remember Bibleopoly? This year-long effort to promote spiritual growth in 2019 is back for 2025!

In 2019, the Discipleship ministry team at Faith encouraged every member to read the Bible in a year. Two Bibleopoly Boards were created so that readers could mark their reading progress and we could see how the reading was going throughout the year. We are going to recreate that deep dive into Scripture in 2025! You are encouraged to choose a Bible plan and, beginning on January 1, join the family of Faith in digging into God's


Word together. You can read the version of your choice, or listen to a recorded or online version as you drive or do things around the house.


There will be Bible reading plans for teens and

before the end of the year. Those who participate in this commitment to read are again encouraged to place a sticker on one of the Bibleopoly boards to mark each book of the Bible that they read. The two boards will be located in the gathering spaces by the sanctuary and by the church offices. We hope that everyone resolves to read the whole Bible, the Old Testament, or the New Testament. Parents can read Bible stories to their children. One way or

another, take a deep dive into the Scriptures in 2025. Look for the Bibleopoly boards and pick your reading plan, so you are ready to start your reading challenge when it kicks off on January 1, 2025!

Our Advent... Holy God

During the month of December, the Foundation worship team will be helping me introduce a new song into our Sunday morning mix, "Only a Holy God." The song itself is not new, being released by City Alight



Music in 2016. However, it has not yet made its way into our Foundation rotation. Recently, the words of this song have been on my heart as we quickly approach the Advent season.

Who else commands all the hosts of heaven? Who else could make every king bow down? Who else can whisper and darkness trembles? Only a Holy God.

"Only a Holy God" is not specifically an Advent or Christmas song, but there are some parallels we can draw from it. The verses list a series of rhetorical questions that are answered by the simple phrase, "Only a Holy God." God is the one who commanded the angel hosts that Christmas night. God is the one who made King Herod afraid for his throne. God is the one who outshines all darkness. This is all true! Only a Holy God, set apart from all else, is capable of such power and majesty. God's power is direct and instant. But then I started to think about these words in the light of Advent and what it means to have an *Advent* God. After all, Advent is the season of preparation, waiting for the arrival of Christ. We live in a culture that detests the idea of waiting. Entertainment is all around us, instantaneously when we request it. So, it can be difficult to wait for God who proves to be all powerful and instant.

What other beauty demands such praises? What other splendor outshines the sun? What other majesty rules with justice? Only a Holy God.

We wait for God to respond to our praises. We want God to outshine all our sorrows with a simple prayer. The earth has been yearning for God's justice for centuries. We want a Holy God but feel as though we have an Advent God. But who here is the one waiting. Is it us or God?

Who else could rescue me from my failing? Who else would offer His only Son? Who else invites me to call Him Father? Only a Holy God.

As it turns out, God waits for us. God has already acted in our lives and continues to act in us every day. We are the ones who are slow to respond. As sin continues to get in the way, God continues to wait. We truly have a Holy God. So, what should our response be this Advent season? The chorus of this song says it well,

Come and behold Him the One and the Only. Cry out sing holy, forever a Holy God.

Come and worship the Holy God!

As we prepare for the coming of Christ this Advent season, also prepare your hearts to receive the instant power of our Holy God's love and forgiveness in your life. Come experience the joy that this season brings by worshiping with us our one and only, Holy God.




