When this article is published, the Leap of Faith capital campaign will be half over. Have you attended a Leap of Faith gathering yet? If not, there are 23 different times between February 8 and 16 that you can attend. Register on-line at *signupgenius.com/go/faithlc* or call the church to register. We are asking each member of the family of Faith to attend *one* gathering to learn more about the need for Phase II of our building project, how Leap of Faith will work and the part that each of us can play in it. Also, watch for a special Leap of Faith devotional book written by members of Faith Lutheran to be used throughout February.

If you have already attended a gathering, this will be a reminder; if not, here's a preview. Two vital convictions lie behind the Leap of Faith capital campaign and the Phase II building project. The first is that this project is needed, not only to accommodate future growth, but also to meet the present needs of Faith's ministry. The Holy Spirit has been at work powerfully in our congregation! Our ministries are flourishing and attendance at worship services is growing. The grace and providence of God is what has brought us to this point.

The other conviction arises from the first and that is that we can meet the goals of Leap of Faith only as the Holy Spirit inspires each of us to leap out in faith. A *strong supporter* of the campaign recently said, "There is nothing rational about this effort." That's true. It's not terribly practical, not carefully prudent and certainly not cautious. It's a bold, even risky act of faith in response to God's promises and the evidence of how He is at work in our midst. But, as Jesus himself promised in the theme verse of the Leap of Faith campaign, "All things can be done for the one who believes." (Mark 9:23)

The members of Faith Lutheran who are leading the Leap of Faith campaign are confident that it is possible to raise \$7-\$10 million dollars, because God has blessed us so generously. That will only happen, however, if all of Faith's members embrace this opportunity as a call from the Holy Spirit to look at our finances in light of God's promises, to give sacrificially, and to trust that, even if we give more generously than we might ever have thought possible, God will continue to provide all that we need for life and health.



On *Leap Day*, Sunday, February 23, members of Faith are asked to return three-year pledge cards for the Leap of Faith campaign. Pledges are *statements* of *intent*, not legal contracts. Should a change in your situation prevent you from fulfilling the pledge, that is not a problem. But please return a pledge card—even if you decide to give nothing!—

because the church can know how to proceed only if we have a reliable sense of how much might be received over the next three years. The next week, March 3, will be *Celebration Sunday* when we will report the response to Leap of Faith and what next steps that result will suggest. Until then, please pray diligently for God to guide your decision and inspire your commitment to Leap of Faith.

Hebrews 11:1 declares that "faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Those two contradictory definitions powerfully describe what it means to take a leap of faith—whether it's to put our faith in Christ in the first place or it's to give sacrificially to the Leap of Faith capital campaign. It is not a sure bet, but a matter of trust. Yet, by the gift of faith, the Holy Spirit does assure us that our hope in Christ is well-founded and convinces us that what we cannot see is nevertheless completely true and utterly reliable.

So, trusting in the crucified and risen Christ, let's come together by February 23 and respond to the powerful work God is doing at Faith Lutheran Church. Together, let's take a Leap of Faith!

Leapers of Faith: Commemorating Some Unsung Saints

St. Valentine's Day and St. Patrick's Day are coming soon, but there are many other saints—official or not—who are honored with special days on the church calendar. This Digging Deeper will focus on several of these faithful servants whose commemoration days fall in this time of year. March 2—John and Charles Wesley, Preachers to the People



Q: If God is all-powerful, why didn't He just wipe out sin and evil, instead of letting it continue?

A: Simply eliminating sin might appear to be straightforward and efficient, but the Bible shows that it is not, for two reasons. The first is that sin runs so deep in people and all creation that it could be removed only by destroying the world and starting over. The other is that God is too invested in creation to do that. As John 3:16 proclaims, "God so loved *the world* that He sent His only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may *not* perish but may have eternal life."

Genesis 6 provides a marvelous example of God's fierce condemnation of sin weighed against His determination to redeem creation. Genesis 6:6-7 tragically reports, "The LORD was sorry that he had made humankind on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart. So the LORD said, 'I will blot out from the earth the human beings I have created...for I am sorry that I have made them." But the *very next verse* says, "But Noah found favor in the sight of the LORD." God was so angry at sin and its destructive effects that He sent the great flood to destroy the earth, but at the exact same time, God loved Noah and his family so profoundly that He allowed him and his family to survive the flood on the ark.

Tragically, Noah barely got off the ark before human sin picked right up where it had left off. Yet, God promised never again to destroy creation by a flood and instead initiated the plan of salvation that began with the call to Abraham and culminated in Jesus' death on the cross. There was nothing straightforward or efficient about that new plan, but its success was assured when Jesus rose from the dead and it will be consummated at the Last Day when he returns in glory.



Stewardship Matters

Once again, the members of Faith Lutheran showed astounding generosity and commitment at the end of 2024. In the month of December alone, just over \$200,000.00 in offerings were given to the General Fund! Moreover, the amount received almost exactly matched what the church needed to break even on the year. The Lord does indeed work in surprising and gracious ways! **Thank you all!**

For as amazing and generous as that outcome was, however, it also raises a concern. Relying on a flood of year-end giving is a long-standing practice at Faith, but it is becoming a bit more pronounced each year. In 2024, fully 22% of all 2024 offerings to the General Fund were given in December. That puts the church in a really vulnerable position. If one "black-swan" event were to occur in a future December, it could cause severe financial trouble for the church.

A year ago, the family of Faith was urged to move some of those late gifts earlier in the year to avoid opening such a big deficit in the General Fund. That didn't happen in 2024. Could we take on that challenge this year and avoid the December panic? What a joy it would be to go through Advent with a lot less worry about Faith covering its ministry expenses for the year. That would make Christmas doubly merry!

Missions

Did you know that Faith Lutheran Church tithes from the general offerings received each year? This year we will use this space in *Faith Matters* to share some of the local and global missions that Faith Lutheran supports through these tithes.



Local Mission Highlights:

There are four ways that FLC supports hunger relief in McLeod County.

- 1) The Blessing Box on the SE corner of the church building. This box is stocked regularly with non-perishable food items that those in need can pickup as they walk by. Donations of food are accepted in the church office and taken outside as needed.
- 2) The monthly Free Community Meals. These meals are served the second Sunday of most months by members of Faith for members of the church and the community.
- 3) The McLeod County Food Shelf is supported through the spring food drive (coming up soon), the October Trick-or-Treat food collection night, and food that is dropped off in the church office and designated for the food shelf.
- 4) The Common Cup weekly backpack program. Through this program bags are packed with food items for children in low-income situations to take home on Fridays to eat throughout the weekend. Each church that participates is asked to help supply a different food item, Faith collects individual fruit and applesauce cups for this program. These donations can be dropped off in the church office anytime.

Global Mission Highlight:

The New Hope Mission Society was formed in 2002 to bring the love of Jesus Christ to the Muslim World after a missionary to India spoke at Faith. Support goes to the Bishara Mission, Shaliach Bible school, Bishara Sewing Project, Otten English School and more. Many of you have met K.K. Alavi and his son Abdul Messiah when they have been in the United States. Today prayers are being asked for:

- * Pastor K.K. Alavi, the long-time leader of the Bishara Center in southeast India. K.K. recently had a surgical procedure to remove a cancerous growth on his liver. The procedure was successful, but he is facing serious health issues now. His physical and emotional well being are weighing heavy on him and he is very weak.
- * Dr. Abdul Messiah, K.K.'s son and administrator of the mission New Hope Mission Society supports, was ordained on January 26. This is the end of a long journey, and he expresses his thanks for our support of his leadership of the mission.


and we can expect cold temperatures here, before welcoming the more soothing spring weather later. Meanwhile, we look for inside things to warm our spirits.




Join us in participating in the fourth annual Handel's *Messiah* concert!


I Am a Baptismal Sponsor. Now What?
