About Faith Lutheran Church

Started by six Danish families in 1870, Faith Lutheran has grown into a vibrant, large congregation located in the mid-size rural town of Hutchinson, MN. Faith Lutheran offers three different worship opportunities and styles on Sunday morning, and has thriving children's and youth ministries, strong seniors' ministries and pastoral care, creative and ambitious missions and outreach, and diverse adult education opportunities. Faith has a twelve person staff of highly qualified and hard-working ministry specialists, and a heart for nurturing leaders.

Hutchinson is a beautiful city of about 15,000 residents in central Minnesota. An hour away from the Twin Cities and St. Cloud, Hutchinson offers the perks of small town life while also being close to big city opportunities.

Mission of the Faith Summer Fellowship Program

The mission of this program is to cultivate young adult Christian leaders and community. We aim to accomplish this by offering multiple hands-on ministry training opportunities in the context of deep and intentional community. Fellows will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in a wide-variety of children and youth ministries and specialized mentoring, while also enjoying intentional communal living and young adult community.

Scope of Fellowship

Fellowships will include a variety of experiences that are comfortable and some that are challenging for the fellow. The fellow will experience all of the summer children's and youth ministries, but can have a greater emphasis on children's ministry or youth ministry, depending on their preference.

Summer children's and youth ministries to expect

- Youth group
- Vacation Bible School
- Middle School Madness
- God Squad
- Drive-In Diner (youth fundraiser)
- Faith Seeds (Sunday Children's sermon)
- Mystery Bus (mini middle school mission trip)
- High School Mission Trip (depending on adult leaders)

We would also love to talk with you more about the possibilities of designing an experience that could fulfill requirements for internships in the following areas: Publications, Graphic Design, Finance, Administration, Marketing, etc.

Ideal candidates for the Summer Fellowship Program

Faith is open to hosting two to three fellows each summer. We are looking for candidates who are either discerning a vocation in the church, pursuing a degree where you would be working with children and/or youth, or you have a love for children and youth ministry. Some fellows may have just finished college, some may be in college and do the internship concurrently, and some will be accomplishing requirements for their training (i.e., seminary vicarage). The ideal candidate is necessarily a growing disciple, engaged with God's word and family, open to the ministry of the Holy Spirit, and respectful. The following would be helpful character traits: curiosity, humor, openness to growth, and willingness to work hard. The candidate is excited to jump into a new community and learn from a new ministry setting.

Particulars

Fellows should expect to work, on average, 30 hours a week in Faith's ministries.

One goal of this internship is to experience a ministry schedule and church life schedule.

You should expect to participate fully as a fellow, and also actively engage in our congregational community. Some of your time spent participating in Faith's events and community opportunities will not count as "work" hours, but will be important opportunities to grow in your Christian discipleship, such as participating in worship.

Expect to meet with your primary mentor at least twice a week: fellow briefing and fellow debriefing. There may be more shadowing of your mentor especially at the beginning of the fellowship. During the first week, fellows will meet to go through expectations and development of what the community culture will look like.

The Ansgar House and other Provisions:

We will provide space and grace for you to be equipped and to be mentored by experienced mentors.

If you do not have a home to stay for the summer, fellows can live in the Ansgar House, a home purchased for the Faith Lutheran interns located a block-and-a-half from the church. The Ansgar House is arranged in a duplex-style, with bedrooms, living areas, and a kitchen on each floor. The women live on the upper level and the men on the main level. Part of the commitment to the internship is committing to a healthy community with your roommates. This includes respecting the space you live in and following Faith's housing policies for God-honoring lifestyles.

We understand that you may need to get another part-time job to cover expenses. We will work with you on daily scheduling, but our expectation is that the internship is the priority.

The intern stipend for a full summer internship is \$2,250.

Summer Fellowship Timeline

The fellowship at Faith is designed to be a summer long experience. Fellows for summer 2025 can look forward to the following dates.

On the day of orientation, fellows will receive important dates that pertain to their primary ministry area.

What will I do during my summer internship?

Here are some ideas of what your schedule might include as an intern at Faith.

Basic

Lutheran theology book study with fellows, mentors, and Pastor Dave Wollan

- Meeting with primary mentor as a group and individually at the beginning and end of the week
- Personal Bible study time
- Personal prayer time
- Communication, advertising, and organizing

Children's Ministry

- Assist with planning, preparing and participating in Vacation Bible School
- Writing and leading a Faith Seeds message (Gospel message for children)
- Assist with planning and preparing fall ministries (primarily Sunday School)

Children's and Youth Ministry

- Writing and leading a God Squad lesson (middle school youth group)
- Assist with planning and preparing Mystery Bus (mini mission trip for middle school students)

Youth Ministry

- Assist with planning and preparing the Mission Trip
- Writing and leading FLY night (game, small groups, message)
- Planning, preparing and participating in Middle School and High School ministry events
- Assist with planning and preparing fall ministries (primarily Confirmation and Youth Group)

Faith's Young Adult Community

As a fellow, you will be involved in Faith's Young Adult Community. This community consists of 18-25-year-olds who are excited to worship and grow in faith together. This community gathers weekly, at the Ansgar House. Each night centers around a meal and some combination of Bible Study, worship, fun activities, and Sporcle parties.
